### **EXPOSITION**

# The purpose of an exposition is to INFLUENCE someone's opinion.

#### **STRUCTURE:**

- INTRODUCTION
   Introduce your
   topic, present your
   point of view and
   provide background
   information.
- A SERIES OF ARGUMENTS Include central points and supporting evidence.
- CONCLUSION
   Summarise your argument.

#### LANGUAGE FEATURES

- SIMPLE PRESENT TENSE
   This gives a more 'up-to-date' feeling to your exposition.
- EMOTIVE LANGUAGE AND MODALS
   Adjust the strength of your argument with modals (e.g. should, must, etc.) and emotive language (e.g. it is 'utterly distressing').
- SENSING VERBS
   Use thinking and feeling verbs to persuade your audience (e.g. 'I believe', 'I feel' or 'I know').
- CONNECTIVES TO LINK ARGUMENTS
   Connect your arguments with words/
   phrases such as 'therefore', 'because' or
   'as a result'.
