



## Make a whale bookmark

Here are the instructions to make your own Southern Right Whale bookmark.

**Please note:** Adult supervision is recommended for this activity. Also, this activity requires blanket, and back stitching. Ask an adult for help with these or there are simple tutorials online.



### What you will need:

- Photocopy of your chosen template. These are on page 3.
- Black or white felt material. You will need enough to cut out 2 of your chosen pattern.
- Black or white cotton. Use black cotton if you are making a white whale, or white cotton if you are making a black whale.
- A sewing needle
- Scissors
- Sewing pins
- A piece of dressmaker's chalk (make sure you have a colour that can be seen on black or white felt)
- Two little eyes
- Craft glue (suitable for attaching the eyes to the felt)

#### Instructions:

- 1. Cut out the pattern you wish to use (large or small).
- 2. Lay the pattern on a piece of felt and pin it in place.
- 3. Slowly cut around the pattern, then remove it and repeat this process so you have two whale pieces. Keep your paper pattern as you will need it in step 6.
- 4. Place the two pieces of felt together and carefully use a few pins to secure them to each other.
- 5. Thread your needle with cotton and use a blanket stitch to sew around the outside of the whale. (see Fig. 1)
- 6. On your paper pattern (not your felt whale), carefully cut a slit along the 'mouth' line.
- 7. Lay your pattern on the whale again and use dressmaker's chalk to draw a line along the mouth slit (so you can see this on the felt).
- 8. Thread your needle again and sew a back stitch along the mouth line. You might need to turn the whale over when you have finished one side and do the other. (see Fig. 2)
- 9. Lastly, take the two eyes and glue one on each side of your bookmark. Place them at the end of your mouth stitch (see Fig. 3)



